

Medical Project Saved One Life and Treated 565 in Kinabatangan

A third medical project was organized by BEST Society in Sukau, Kinabatangan on 16-17th November. A joint project with Sky Community Bhd, Sabah State Health and Dental Department, Sukau Rainforest Lodge, Borneo Eco Tours and co-sponsored by Kinabatangan Corridor of Life Tourism Operators Association, Sabah (KiTA) it was aimed to provide free medical and dental treatment to the community in Sukau, Bilit and Abai villages. Currently, the villagers in the areas have to travel 1-2 hours to the nearest hospital in Kota Kinabatangan or Sandakan to seek medical treatment.

A total of 68 volunteers including 7 doctors, 1 Medical Officer, 6 dentists, 9 nurses, 3 pharmacists, 1 nutritionist travelled 8 hours overland from Kota Kinabalu, Sandakan and Kinabatangan and spent four days to serve community. A total of 565 patients were treated including 208 seeking dental treatment (Sukau; 312, Bilit; 115 and Abai; 138). Among the most common diagnoses of the patients here include hypertension, diabetes, respiratory diseases and fungal infections and skin allergies. The medical project also saved the life of a boy, Mohammad Razman, 10, of Kg. Abai who was diagnosed just in time with acute appendicitis. He was sent by Borneo Eco Tours speed boat to Sukau, and thereafter, transferred bν to Kinabatangan and Sandakan Hospital for immediate surgery.







This is the third medical project organized by BEST Society (www.bestsociety.org). The medical project cost a total of RM35,042.36 which include promotion, homestay (RM2,100.00) (RM7,427.86), medicines accommodation and meals of the volunteers. Main sponsors, KiTA (www.kitaborneo.org) contributed a total of RM20,000.00 with the balance sponsored by BEST Society (RM4,259.56), Sukau Rainforest Lodge (www.sukau.com) (RM7.840.00) and Eco Tours (www.borneoecotours.com) (RM2,385.00) while Skv Community (www.skylinesib.com) co-ordinated the trip of the volunteers from government hospitals, private clinics and private sectors

"This project is very beneficial for us. We don't have to travel far to Kota Kinabatangan for check up. There is no similar medical projects held here before", she said.

Another local patient who came here to seek dental treatment, Risiman bin Bani welcomed the medical outreach at Kg. Billt. "It makes it convenient for the villagers, who have difficulties to go to the town. Everything is at our doorstep and we hope that such project will be held here more often".

Jamal bin Ingau, the head of village of Kg. Abai had nothing but praise for the effort to provide medical check up for the residents there.

"There's no medical facility in the village while other medical outreach programmes only catered to women and children. The journey to Sandakan by boat takes between one and two hours and the fee itself is RM20 per person per way, which is expensive for the residents here", he said.

Meanwhile, the medical project here offered a wonderful opportunity to volunteers and doctors to help and be acquainted with the local community.

"The initiative for community service done through the years in different ways by the BEST Society and Sky Community is very commendable as it portrays the heart of leaders, to love others as they love themselves. This is my first joining this camp in Sukau and it brings me joy to serve the poor who have difficulties in accessing even the most basic healthcare. The spirit of excellence was definitely among the volunteers, and numerous friendships were made and strengthened", said Dr. Narjit Kaur of Klinik Pergigian Beaufort.

"I truly appreciate the opportunity to serve the community out of my normal routine hospital work. Volunteer work is always fun as new friendships and new experiences are made through serving both Kampung Sukau and Kampung Abai. I had the best time of my life; truly an unforgettable adventure from sighting the Borneo Pygmy Elephant (rare opportunity) to riding night river cruise under the forest and looking for salt water crocodiles to convincing my patient why smoking is bad for him.", Dr. Erin Ong of Queen Elizabeth Hospital II, Kota Kinabalu told us in an interview.

Sowing into lives and making a difference without counting the cost, with no strings attached - voluntary activities such as this is liberating and rewarding! Thank you for the privilege and opportunity to serve.
